Trees will not be topped or trimmed without Zoning Administrator's Approval. Clear cutting is prohibited regardless of the size of the trees. Property owners are encouraged to use an ISA Certified Arborist to prune and remove trees and will be solely at the expense of the applicant.

Trees are an important part of maintaining the natural beauty of our community. As a result, property owners have an obligation to their neighbors and the community to adhere to these guidelines. Property owners who fail to adhere to these guidelines set forth may be required to replant trees as specified by the Zoning Administrator. In addition, in some cases where property owners obtain approval to remove a tree, the Zoning Administrator may require that a tree be replanted in its place.
