# A Regular Meeting of the VILLAGE COUNCIL OF SUGAR MOUNTAIN MINUTES

1. Call to Order of Regular Meeting – Mayor Gunther Jochl called the Regular Meeting of Council to order at 4:00 p.m. with a quorum present as follows:

# 8. Departmental Reports

## a. Village Manager's Report – Susan Phillips

Construction continues the rebuilding of the golf course and will continue into the Spring, with stream restoration taking place over the winter months. Overall, there has been a decrease of 37.65% in revenues for the period April – October 15<sup>th</sup> in comparison to the same period in 2024. We will close the season following play on Sunday, October 26<sup>th</sup>. Tennis has seen a decrease of 10.87% in revenues for the period May-October 15, 2025, in comparison to the same period in 2024. The Tourism and Development Authority approved the annual Golf and Tennis Landscaping agreement with Phil Sisco and a 12-month contract with Bramble Media & Marketing. The August 2025 collection of the occupancy tax showed a decrease of 19% in comparison to August 2024. Tri-County Paving has been in the Village performing the prep work needed for repairs and paving on streets that have damage due to Helene. These streets include Grouse Moor Drive, Mossy Creek Rd, Park Lane, Rock Spring Circle, Slope View Road, and Rough Ridge Road. A list of Helen expenditures and reimbursements were listed in the report.

# b. Police Chief's Monthly Report - Chief Casey Turbyfill

The Police Department is operating well. Officer Clark resigned her position as a full-time police officer; her last shift was on September 30<sup>th</sup>. Officer Clark will continue to assist the police department as needed as a reserve officer. Oktoberfest this year was the largest I can recall in my time as the police Department. SMPD had three officers on duty during the busiest times and thankful that no incidents were reported. All full-time SMPD Officers are now intox EX/IR II Certified, enabling them to administer breath alcohol tests in Driving While Impaired Investigations. ## c. Public Works Director's Monthly Report – Bill Daniels

The crew has finished up the seasonal mowing. Time has turned to the task of keeping the leaves out of the culverts and ditches. We have completed installation of several additional streetlights and made repairs to some wiring issues that were affecting other lights. Mountain Electric is in the process of replacing the old mainline wire on Crestview Lane and will be working toward the intersection of Elk Horn and Sugar Mountain Drive. The process of repairing Timber Ridge Road and Mossy Creek Lane is still in the engineering – design phase and we hope to get this project underway very soon. It is my intention to open the 16<sup>th</sup> hole for play on our last day to be able to say that Helene didn't defeat us, it only set us back for a brief time.
