REPORT TO VILLAGE COUNCIL
June 18, 2026

I would like to thank the Village Council for its consideration of the proposed fiscal budget. In recent years, the Police Department has become better equipped than ever before with the tools and equipment needed to perform our duties to the highest standard. The department continues to operate effectively.

Our newest officer, Marvin Sanchez-Fabian, has completed field training and has been assigned to the night shift. Officer Kiefer has been assigned to a split shift, assisting both day and night shifts. This split shift schedule has proven to be a valuable asset to the department by helping cover staffing shortages and providing support to both shifts.

Chief Turbyfill and Officer Brown completed RADAR recertification and received certification that will remain active for three (3) years. North Carolina is one of the more strict states in the country when it comes to RADAR Certification. Officers are required to demonstrate 100% accuracy in the familiarization and operation of the specific RADAR unit. Officers must successfully pass the state exam with a score of 80% or higher. The Sugar Mountain Police Department now has three certified RADAR operators. In years past, the department had only one, and at most two, certified RADAR operators.

Half of the department recently completed firearms in-service training. The remaining personnel were scheduled to complete training on June 18, 2026; however, due to incoming weather, the training was canceled. I am currently awaiting a rescheduled date.

I would like to remind everyone to remain mindful of posted speed limits throughout the Village. With warmer weather here, we expect an increase in pedestrians, hikers, and cyclists enjoying the area. Speed limits are clearly posted: side streets are **15 MPH** zones, while Grouse Moor Drive and Sugar Mountain Drive are **25 MPH** zones. Speeding remains a significant contributing factor in motor vehicle crashes. Officers will be conducting RADAR enforcement to help maintain safe traffic speeds.

The summer concert series has begun. Officers have been conducting foot patrols and monitoring for parking-related issues. I enjoyed speaking with several attendees during this past Wednesday's event.

As always, I would like to thank every member of our department for their dedication and hard work. Sugar Mountain Police Department has a great group of Officers, who are well trained and experienced. We all will continue to improve our operations and remain committed to providing the highest level of public safety service to our residents, guests, businesses and visitors. We appreciate the continued support and the opportunity to serve the Village of Sugar Mountain.

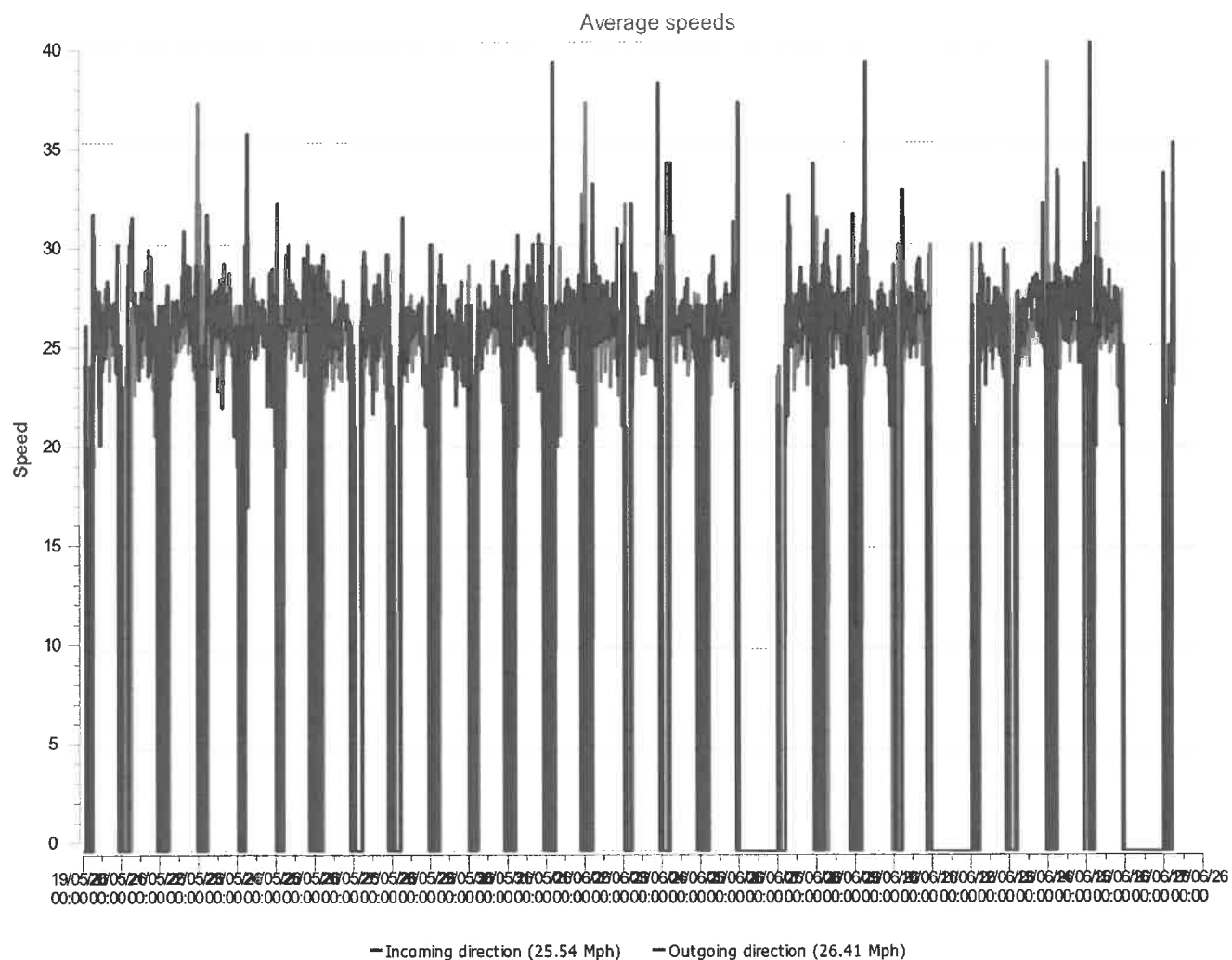
